 - Kevin introduced Sue-Ellen Holst as Sparks Street BIA Main Street Ambassador
 - Sue-Ellen introduced, and did a summary of the Main Street Ambassador program, and role in growing business and recruiting, through community market share data report, once that is macro overview of the community we will be providing each business use the data to opportunities to identify gaps and opportunities for new businesses, for owners of the properties, great to know whats in the hopper,
 - <u>ACTION</u> Sue-Ellen will present the data when ready
 - Kevin remarked that Environics is executing the study, we may be able to use this as real time tracking of cellular data on a basis to get an idea of footfall

- 6. **Occupation Report** Kevin produced a deck summarizing the Occupation and steps taken and impacts
- Jeff wanted to confirm if bollards would be used for traffic management, Kevin responded that weather is a challenge, operational cost not budgeted, do not want to incur the cost as decision has been made by municipal and federal staff we would have to start paying for it ourselves, and we will end up having to repair them
- They are examining the perimeter as we speak and they are required to consult with BIA and other businesses prior to closing Wellington, they have one week and a half to do consultations, we have spoken to the City Special Events team, they are not in favour of this but they must attempt before cancelling the idea
- Kevin confirmed there are police at Wellington perimeter, but there have been operational challenges with who is managing the check points
- Closing off Metcalfe/Queen is not an option has maintenance has to be done,
- Ian Wright, they'd have to change Metcalfe/O'Connor into two way streets
- Kevin confirmed that vehicular traffic is becoming a challenge, there is pressure on this temporary solution as financial challenges with paid duty
- Barriers would have to be staffed
- We will advocate for the best for the street.

7. Parliamentary Precinct Presentation – PSPC

- Scott presented the Sparks Street project overview highlights commitment to ground floor retail and ensure engagement with the BIA and the Mall Authority and highlights commitment to architectural design
- 100 Sparks will remain for BIA office as long as possible
- *Kevin would like to see collaborative opportunity to chat about opportunity in advance of the design competition*
