3. Opening Remarks – Court Curry

- Kevin put together list of short term wins should funding opportunities open
- Work continues on the Siting of the Public Washroom, identifying location and what type of facility will be built. Working on December 31st timeline.

4. Public Realm Project Update- Kevin

a. Community Garden

- Kevin presented the Proposal (see attached deck)
- Grant application into Healthy Communities Initiatives still pending
- Uptake has been soft from CCA, waiting on next steps and circling back for final decision based on timeline could become corporate initiative
- We want to make sure that make the best of the opportunity with the right partners/participants
- Lafleur will put flowers into the space regardless but will come back with ask for your final input

b. Play and Grow

- Recommended to remove three trees, trimming of some, we will work with the Arborist team to remove the tree and replace with another tree if no room on Sparks we would donate a tree to the city to donate to another space in the core.
- David is asking Parks and Rec for support on this project
- We will go to RFP on this once its ready for tender
- May explore support, OC Transpo (LRT outreach) if train structure, there is an alignment

c. Water filling stations

- 2 or 3 required quotes are in and coming in at the same price point.
- They all chose the same unit
- Modern Niagara, Trangeau, Optimum 8K per unit will come down to hourly rate
- Amenity we have been missing on the street
- Court question: Any program that promotes City of Ottawa water/water stations that could subsidize or support what Sparks Street is doing
- David: not aware of a program ACTION but will reach out to Kevin in Parks,
- Catherine: ACTION: Will look into it because it's not park space, may not qualify for cash in lieu
- Kevin: we are a road in name only, jests that we fit into a different category any opportunity to leverage or subsize would be great

d. Asphalt Painting

e. Light Court

- Ask Ian to consider rolling this into the décor budget on BIA side

- Hope it to keep the trees on the street for all year round and gives canvas for lighting
- Muskoka chair has individual seating
- Could be an additional performance area with additional performers in the summer over a large event like Buskers
- Boxes built to a standard, 2x4 steal framed, high finish, good warmth
